Information about the activity

How will we be organized

As you know, the EsJamboree is organized through activities aimed to each Educational Branch (sections). Only on July 22 activities will be aimed for the groups. The base camp is organized in 6 sub-camps, one for each section (in "La Laguna de Valleseco") and one for IST and organization in a field closed to it.

An adequate parcel will be allocated to each Educational Branch within the sub-camps depending on the number of people and tents indicated per section. In these parcels will camp both participants and Scout Leaders of the section, although they will sleep in different tents as it is not allowed under any circumstances.

At the same time, each educational branch will be divided into different subgroups consisting of complete natural units (36 participants + 4 scout leaders), for the routes and the activities (with the exception of the Rover section, which will perform the routes according to the physical skills/abilities of the rovers, staying always with their natural clans).

The names of the subgroups of the Educational Branches will be the following:

- Beavers: Nayra and Yeray
- Cubs: Imobach, Tigot, Magec, and Enac
- Scouts: Bardino, Graja, Salmor and Hubara
- Ventures/Pioneers: Ghomara, Eceró, Benahoare and, Maxorata
- Rovers/Companions: Mexican Border, Sirian Path and African Line

In short we will notify in which subgroup will be allocated each unit.

If any group, due to the number of participants or scout leaders, has to share the plot with another group already predetermined, should contact servicios.esjamboree@scout.es before July 7.

The meals will be organized in general by educational branches. There are meals schedules for each section and even specific allocation of tables in the dining room. This will favour a better organization and efficiency. It will be important to collaborate with the food managers to keep order and diligence when distributing the food, eating and cleaning up the tables. You will receive further information about this soon.

The showers, laundries and other infrastructures of the camp, must always be used under the supervision of the scout leader of the section. Participants cannot make use of them alone. There are no predetermined times for the use of showers or laundries, they must be foreseen for compliance with established schedules of activities.

Buses (called "guaguas" in the Canary Islands) will be organized with respect to the educational branches (except July 22 that will be by groups), trying to maintain the natural sections or units, although under the premise of completing all the places of each vehicle for each route. It will be informed before each activity, the departure point/time, bus number and number of passengers of the section or unit. Scout leaders will be responsible for being punctual and keep the control of participants in the vehicle (this together with the person designated by the organization).



All scout leaders and adults in the EsJamboree, will have defined roles and responsibilities, and everyone is expected to collaborate and participate to achieve an unforgettable experience. Scout leaders will collaborate in the development of the activities of its Educational Branch, together with IST and organizational team.

The Trip

We are checking the flights, arrival and departure times, and all those issues related to your travels. We will contact you to confirm all that information.

It is important for you to know that at your arrival you will have at the airport/port a person of reference who will support you with anything you may need. Depending on the date of arrival, the transfer will be made to the place of hospitality or to the camp.

Do not forget to identify clearly your luggage. We also recommend you to take a photo of every package you may check-in and make sure that just one scout leader picks up all the luggage tags. In case of loss the process will be more agile and efficient.

Weather

The weather in the camp area, La Laguna de Valleseco, will be summer, with an average temperature between 23°- 30°C es (74.3°-86°F), but refresh at night and there is plenty of humidity. No rain is expected but if there are, they will be of little or medium intensity and short duration.

The rest of places to visit do not differ much, but they vary. If adverse weather, cold or unusual weather is anticipated, prompt information will be given and, if necessary, appropriate measures will be taken.

Scout Hospitality

Scout hospitality is provided by *Scouts-Exploradores de Canarias*, as an additional service to facilitate the stay for those groups who choose to come days before or stay days after the EsJamboree.

The registration fee of EsJamboree only covers food from July 18 lunch (picnic) to July 28, outside of this, Groups may choose to manage their food or hire it through the Organization with the catering that will serve us in the event, and at the same price. We want to point out that it will be difficult to cook in schools or premises and it is completely prohibited to do so in camp areas, for risk of fires.

The EsJamboree fee includes the transfer from the airport/port to the central camp or place of hospitality (depending on what they have choose), and from the central camp or the place of hospitality to the airport/port. Any extra trips that you want to do outside the EsJamboree dates or the complementary transfers (arrival/return) if they are hosted in Hospitality, are not included. However the Hospitality Committee of SEC could support them since it has been agreed with the companies equal prices to those obtained for the EsJamboree, much more advantageous.



Regarding the accommodation, this will be in schools, scout premises or campsites, according to the preferences you indicate and the possibilities available, based on the registered requests for Hospitality.

From the Commission for Hospitality of Scouts-Exploradores de Canarias those groups that requested this service will be contacted shortly in order to help them to plan their stay, assigning group and scout leaders guides, allocating them accommodation, and helping them to plan meals, transport, visits, and any other support they may need.

Scout Image

Beyond the common rules in every scout camp and we already know in general, this activity requires a special sensitivity in our behaviour, image and performance, since we will be very visible and visit many places, so that clearly who see us will value Scouting for our performance.

We will pay special attention to the correct use of uniformity. The scarf to be worn is that of the event and no other, and should be used in every activity and moment during the camp.

The Uniform (with the event scarf delivered as part of the kit) will be used at least at the following events:

- Opening ceremony on July 18 (afternoon)
- Roque Nublo Route for Ventures/Pioneers on July 19
- Teide Route for Rovers/Companions on July 20
- Gathering in Tenerife on July 21 (visit to the Parliament of the Canary Islands at noon)
- Song Festival on July 22
- Visit to Las Palmas de Gran Canaria on July 23
- Teide Route for Ventures/Pioneers on July 25
- Roque Nublo Route for Scouts on July 24 and 25.
- Gathering in Tenerife, July 26 (visit to the Parliament of the Canary Islands, noon)
- Closing Ceremony on July 27

The correct use of the uniform is requested in the round trips, as well as in the ceremonies.

Safety

The EsJamboree will be governed by a Self-Protection Plan in which all issues related to the safety of the participants have been assessed, in each and every one of the activities, events or actions.

In addition, the Plan involves other public and private entities that will make possible to guarantee the safety during EsJamboree, but this, to a large extent, will also depend on us, to assume the safety principles and norms, and to be properly prudent and consistent in all our actions. It is highly recommended for scout leaders to download the following apps available at [Google Play](#) and [App Store](#)..:

- **Alertcorps** ([see more info](#)): This app allows alerting the security services of the Spanish State Security Forces and Corps of the possible commission of crimes or misdemeanours, gearing the alert person and moving the Police and Civil Guard, after its verification, to the area. Its use is restricted for people of legal age and it is necessary to be registered to use it. The cases that can be reported are: theft, robbery, vandalism



or damage, aggression, sexual assault, missing person, and it also has a test alert option. Their misuse can be considered a crime.

- **Fress** ([see more to info](#)): In case of emergency, this app will geolocate and connect you with the Emergency Coordinating Center of 112 activating the necessary resources, which also includes Police and Civil Guard. It works equally on all islands, just like in all of Europe. The options of the “camera positioning” and “activation of video camera” of your Smartphone are of total utility for the care resources.

Very important will be the prevention and the previous control. You should not forget to bring all the Medical Records, of Food & Dietary Requirements Form, Authorizations, Certificates of Exemption from Sexual Offenses, etc.

In the camp area we will have a control centre and in each activity the necessary elements and precise supports. In order to guarantee the correct attention to any contingency we will have a unique emergency telephone and each participant will have it printed on their control and identification bracelet, along with their personal data.

It is totally forbidden to make fire of any type in practically all the rural or forest areas that we are going to visit. You should verify that your participants won't bring: lighters, matches, flint or sparking, or any other element of this type.

Alcoholic Beverage and Smoking

In any of the EsJamboree enclosures will an option to have or drink alcoholic beverages neither will be having tobacco nor smoking (in any variety or type). The organization, all the scout leaders and volunteers participating in the event, must watch over this basic health and safety premise, enforcing it and being an example in its fulfilment.

Obviously the possession or consumption of illegal substances or legally prohibited have no place in the EsJamboree under any concept or circumstance. Non-compliance with these guidelines may lead to an invitation to leave the activity, following joint assessment between the Organization and the Head of Contingent.

Access to enclosures and activities

Participation is only allowed for those correctly registered at the ESJamboree. The activities will be fully planned and under security control according to participants previously fully defined for each one, being absolutely impossible to incorporate punctual or unexpected activities or abandon them without justified cause.

Participation in the scheduled activities is compulsory for those registered, except for reasons justified by medical teams or the organization of the EsJamboree.

Access to the camp area or the Festival venue, as well as to other areas or activity enclosures, shall be restricted to participants and accredited third party staff. For the access of parents/legal guardians/relatives or friends, it will be necessary an invitation to access the camp.



EsJamboree rules

For the good development of the activities, and appealing to the Spirit Scout, the following rules are compulsory for all the EsJamboree attendants.

Scout behaviour and Image:

- ⦿ During these days, keep in mind that you will live with people from very different backgrounds, cultures and religions. Respecting the traditions and customs of each one.
- ⦿ Do not forget that this activity is aimed to all the educational branches from Beavers to Rovers, with different needs but with the same rights and obligations.
- ⦿ Everybody must respect the signals and indications of the IST members as well as those people assigned by the organization for each task/role. Remember that you are not alone.
- ⦿ In general, in the activities, we will wear short pants and T-shirt, along with the EsJamboree's scout scarf (only that one). The scout uniform will be used in the days indicated for it. For the kind of the activity we will be more than ever, the image of Scouting in all the places we will visit.
- ⦿ The places that you will visit, its people and its institutions, have collaborated to make the adventure of the EsJamboree be possible. Be polite and respectful with them. Also be clean and ordered, leaving the place in better conditions.
- ⦿ Try to ensure that our activity, games, songs or actions, do not disturb third parties, residents of the village, users of beaches or visitors of those places we will go. Let's be considerate of others
- ⦿ During the EsJamboree there will be many moments to share so putting music at full volume or with your helmets is not a good option. In any case, do not bother the rest with noises.
- ⦿ Violence, discrimination or intolerance, in any form or degree, are not allowed in the EsJamboree.

Premises and Places:

- ⦿ Access to working areas is limited to the organization and, where appropriate, to IST members or to scout leaders under authorization.
- ⦿ The access of the participants to the infrastructures or services areas (dining room, kitchens, showers, toilets, infirmary or similar), must always be accompanied by a Scout leader.
- ⦿ It is totally forbidden to swim in La Laguna de Valleseco and those beaches that we visit must always be carried out under the supervision of a Scout leader. Otherwise you should not get into the water, even if you know how to swim. Never go to the water alone.
- ⦿ We must respect the rules that govern each of the places we will visit, even if they seem to be weird for you. Likewise, we must comply with the indications given by those responsible for each place, the authorities or the police, and we must comply with the indications that the local people can make us.
- ⦿ In the dining area you must respect the tables, rows or areas that are assigned for eating or waiting. You should keep your shift if it is the case and be patient. Respect the work of others.

Only will be allowed for the groups, under the authorization of the organization, the exchanges and sale done on the days and areas foreseen in the program, except for the EsJamboree store.



Environment

- ✦ Participants cannot be in shower or laundry areas without the supervision of a scout leader, who will be responsible for opening and closing de taps, to avoid wasting and preserving the facilities.
- ✦ In the showers and laundries of the central camp you can only use the shampoo or soap provided by the organization. Water in the Canary Island is a precious commodity and we should not contaminate it.
- ✦ It is totally forbidden to make fire, in the camping areas as in the places that we visit, in any form or by any means. The scouter leaders will watch so that there are no lighters, matches, flints or sparks, etc, in the hands of the participants during the activities.
- ✦ Keeping clean the camp, schools and pavilions that we will use is everyone's task. We must deposit all the waste inside the corresponding garbage containers, keep the spaces and bathrooms clean.
- ✦ It will not be necessary to use knives or axes, so that better not bring them

Security:

- ✦ All the activities and places at EsJamboree are under a self-safety plan. In case of emergency, please, stay calm (and if you are a Scout Leader keep calm your underage scouts). Members of the staff will indicate the orders to follow. Just follow their instructions and be calm. Instructions from the organization shall not be questioned.
- ✦ The Security Team and all the IST members and the Staff will be rightly identified. Their mission is to make the rules are met and look after for our security, so please, collaborate with them as much as possible.
- ✦ Remember: Organization Team members will wear an orange scarf. IST members will wear a green pistachio colour scarf.
- ✦ On the Camp zone will be a well signalized first-aids area. If it's not an emergency, participants should be accompanied by a Scout Leader.
- ✦ The HoC –or the medical or alimentation managers- must have around all the documents and authorizations in case of necessity to check any data.
- ✦ Its mandatory to wear during all the activity the ID bracelet and also your scarf.

Any incident or accident must be announced to the organization. In case of emergency you have to call to: +34687483454 (the number is also printed on the ID bracelet) and keep calm and follow instructions.

Security on the camp zone:

- ✦ Entries and leavings from/to the Camp Zone are regulated for people and vehicles. So any entry or leave must be authorized by the Head of Camp. Participants can't leave the Camp Zone if were not authorized and supervised by a Scout Leader. Also, it's not allowed to entry on the Camp Zone without the right authorization
- ✦ The road to the entrance to Camp zone is only for the organization cars rightly accredited.
- ✦ There are some parkings inside the Camp Zone for the accredited vehicles, and outside the Camp Zone for the visitors.
- ✦ Participants will attend the activities in the organization transports. If due a medical indication or other circumstance any participant may no assist to one activity, this information must be communicated to the Head of Camp.
- ✦ Camp Zone is a Fencing zone. There is only an entrance that will be monitored. Entries and exits will be controlled and will be not permitted to strangers.
- ✦ On the Camp zone will be a 24/7 service of volunteers and also an always available a Head of Camp.



- ✦ Any incident, accident, emergency or special need must be communicated as soon as possible by the Scouts Leaders to the IST, members of the organization or to the Head of Camp.
- ✦ On the Camp Zone make bivouac or sleep out of the tents is not allowed. We highly recommend to rest on the time schedule for it and in your designated tent.
- ✦ It's not allowed to share tent between legal underage people and adults.

Schedule

- ✦ Rest and silence period is from 23:30 to 07:30. This period must be respected. Remember there are a lot of scouts resting or sleeping during this period.
- ✦ If necessary, organization may designate specific zones to develop activities over the silence time, without affectation to the rest of the people.
- ✦ Access to shower zone, laundry zone and dining tent are limited to the specific and designated times and always will be done under supervision of a Scout Leader.

Substances, equipment and personal material:

- ✦ Is absolutely forbidden to consume cigarettes or tobacco, any kind of alcoholic drink and any kind of drugs or narcotics in any camp area or activity during the EsJamboree Camp.
- ✦ Adults or under legal age with a specific permission may ask to the organization for specific smoking areas outside the Camp Zone.
- ✦ Mobile phones, tablets or any other electronic devices are not recommended during the Camp. There will be not an available electric charging area. On the places where could be possible charge the devices, the preferences will be for the organization members, IST, HoC, medical or alimentation managers and Scout Leaders, just by this order.
- ✦ It's recommended to mark all your clothes and belongings (our recommendation is to do it like your sheet on the census: CN 35 105 0082 and the Name "L. Martin R"). Remember to bring your own felt-tip pen to mark the kit we will give to any participant.

Self Protection:

- ✦ Is forbidden take photos, record videos or share them on Social Networks if you don't have the specific authorization of the Organization. You only could take photos or record videos of a specific Scout Group or Unity if their Scout Leader authorized.
- ✦ Please, avoid constant overexposure to the sun. Wear always the cap, even in the beach. Wear sunscreen. If you don't have, ask for it to your Scout Leaders.
- ✦ Take care of your belongings. Especially on the trips and tours. Try to be tidy and keep your luggage neat. You are the only responsible of your belongings

Please, do realize that there will be a lot of people with different cultures, so, please, try to wear properly and respectfully, also when go/come from the showers zone. Bikini or bath clothes are only permitted in the beach and following the specific rules.

Rules observance:

- ✦ Any infringement, breach of the rules or any anti Scout Style behavior will be communicated to the Committee which will decide the consequences.



Luggage and materials to bring

There is a little list to orientate the material you may bring.

- Backpack (no too big, you may use it for the routes and excursions)
- Sleeping bag
- folding mat
- Short trousers
- Large trousers
- T-shirts
- Scout Uniform
- Underwear
- Pijama
- Personal Hygiene Articles
- Towel
- Swimwear / Bikini
- Footwear (including boots, sneakers and sandals)
- Coat, anorak or rain jacket.
- Glass (with handle if possible).
- 1L Canteen
- AAA batteries (3 at least)
- Id National Card or Passport

And the needs for groups:

- Sleeping tents (by unity and different tents for scout leaders/adults and participants)
- Long Pegs for Tents (Not compact soil)
- It is recommended to bring a little lantern (no gas) for the tents

The biggest construction you could do is a clothesline, you do not need to bring pioneering material.

The participant' kit will include (and it's not necessary to bring)

- Little backpack
- Notebook
- Event scarf and badge
- Cap
- cookware
- Little led lantern
- Standard sunscreen.

Not recommended bring electronic devices, books, high value elements, medicaments not under medical control or high amounts of money.

Are forbidden knives, machetes, axes, lighthfires, or any other fire-maker element.
